## NOT SURE HOW TO START YOUR MOVE TO ERP LN

**Worried that you may have processes that will fall through the holes?** OST has helped many customers identify process gaps when moving to LN. - Creatively architecting a move front office, order management, warehousing and finance to ERP LN while interfacing back to Baan IV manufacturing to gain the benefits of the latest LN software functionality, allowing the customer to reap the benefits of LN functionality while reducing the risk of migration project pieces.

### BAAN TIP OF THE MONTH:

**Do you want to see your company's logo when logging on to Baan or ERP LN?** To see your own logo on the BW client login splash, on each client machine, replace the file %BSE%\lib\bwlogo.bmp with a bwlogo.bmp file containing your logo.

To change the splash that displays when a session opens, replace the file \$BSE/gif/bwlogo.gif on the server with your own bwlogo.gif file. For Webtop/WebUI, you have the option to change the standard Infor logo to your own using the Administration console's Company Logo option.
